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What we are learning

This month in Math we are continuing to decompose numbers into groups to make number sentences/story. You may have heard your student say "When you have 3 purple flowers and 2 white flowers you have 5 flowers all together!" This is a great skill to introduce simple addition problems. After this unit we will begin Module 2 in math, which will start focusing on 2 dimensional and 3 dimensional shapes.

By the end of our Module your student will have met these many Colorado Academic Standards! Here are just a few: MATH.PK.1.P.CC.5 - Accurately count as many as five objects in a scattered configuration or out of a collection of more than five objects

MATJ.PK.1.P.CC.E.9- Associate a number of objects with a written numeral 0-5

MATH.PK.P.CC.E.10- Recognize and, with support, write some numerals up to 10.

In literacy we will continue to focus on uppercase letters and letter sounds. We encourage students to practice writing their names whenever possible!
